P-NATS' LOSE A RAIN-SHORTENED GAME: It was a wet night in Kinston, NC -- and a sour ending to the P-Nats' three-game series with the Indians, as the K-Tribe won a rain-shortened game on Sunday afternoon, 4-1. The first pitch was delayed one hour, 18 minutes. The two teams started play and the Indians scored in the bottom of the second on a Matt Whitney single to center field. The K-Tribe would add two more runs in the bottom of the third on a two-run homer to right by Jordan Brown, his 10th homer of the year and second of this series. That made it 3-0. The P-Nats would get one back in the top of the fifth on a homer to left-center field by Cristian Guerrero. Then, after one batter in the bottom of the fifth, the rains came again, forcing another delay, this one an hour and 35 minutes. The K-Tribe got a run in the bottom of the fifth, but then, come the top of the sixth, it started to pour. The two teams played through three batters. But after a couple strikeouts and a walk, the umpires called it again. It was then decided that the game would not be continued.

YEPEZ CALLED UP, P-NATS GET TWO PLAYERS: Marcos Yopez has been called up to Double-A Harrisburg. With Potomac this year, Yopez played a variety of positions: 3B, 2B, SS and LF. He played in 69 games with the P-Nats and hit .249 with four homers and 32 RBIs. He had 10 doubles and 17 stolen bases. His season highlight came on June 11 at Frederick when he hit for the cycle. The last time a Prince William/Potomac player had hit for the cycle was when Andy Fox did it in 1991 against Lynchburg. In Yopez' place, plus to fill the hole for the recently departed Alex Morales, the P-Nats got two players from the Savannah Sand Gnats of the Sally League: Right-handed pitcher Brett Reid and infielder Alex Nunez. Santos pitched in 11 games for Savannah – all in relief – and went 0-2 with two saves and a 6.39 ERA in 12-2/3 innings pitched. Nunez hit .267 (51x191) with nine doubles, three triples and 15 RBIs. He also stole 9 bases. Nunez saw time in his first day with Potomac, on Saturday, July 22 against Kinston, going in as a defensive replacement at third. He had one at-bat and had an infield single and RBI.

SO LONG ALEX: Relief pitcher Alex Morales has been called up to Double-A Harrisburg. He got the call on Tuesday night and by Wednesday, already saw action for the Senators in the team's 1-0 victory over the Connecticut Defenders. He pitched a scoreless seventh inniing and had two strike outs. The on Thursday, Morales pitched again, tossing two scoreless innings with two strikeouts in a Senators win against the Akron Aeros. With the P-Nats this season, Morales went 3-2 with two saves and had a 2.17 ERA. All 32 appearances were out of the pen. Opponents hit only .189 off him.

NOT COKE, NOT PEPSI... IT'S ZINICOLA: 6-foot-1, 220-pound right-hander Zechry Zinicola made his Potomac debut on Saturday, July 15 against the Lynchburg Hillcats. In his first week with the team, he has already appeared in three ballgames and has a 5.40 ERA, going five innings, and allowing three earned runs, eight hits and two walks. He's struck out four batters. The Washington Nationals selected Zinicola in the sixth round – 181st overall pick – of the June draft, out of Arizona State University.

OUT WITH THE OLD AND IN WITH THE... WELL, OLD! Catcher Robert Rodriguez has retired. He worked in a backup role with the Nationals. His replacement is Russ Cleveland, who fans might recognize from him playing two different times earlier in the year with the P-Nats. Cleveland has split time this year between Potomac and Triple-A New Orleans.

EDGAR CACERES: Edgar Caceres managed the 2004 Potomac Cannons to a first half championship and their first post-season appearance since 1995. The former big-league infielder led the then Cannons to a 37-32 mark in the first half of the 2004 season. After the team finished third in the second half, the Cannons went on to fall to Wilmington two games to one in the Northern Division Championship Series. The win came at home. Caceres, 42, spent five seasons managing in the Reds organization while posting overall record of 224-225. Last season, Caceres managed Sarasota in the Advanced-A Florida State League to a 65-67 record before joining the Nationals organization during the off-season. In 1995, Caceres played in 55 games for the Kansas City Royals and hit .239 with six doubles, one home run and 28 RBI.

NATIONALS BRIEFING

JOSE GUILLEN HELPS NATS TOP KEYS: Potomac was 3-0 while Washington Nationals outfielder Jose Guillen was with the team rehabbing his right hamstring. Guillen traveled to Frederick and gathered two hits in six at-bats for Potomac. Both of Guillen's hits were homeruns. The first one came in the first game of the double header on June 9th. He smashed a laser shot over the center field fence off Garrett Olson to give the Nats a 1-0 lead. Then, he hit a line drive over the right field fence in the night cap. Guillen's blast handed the Nats a 2-0 lead in the first inning.

PEDRO ASTACIO STARTED FOR THE P-NATS: Washington Nationals RHP Pedro Astacio, who was rehabbing from a strained forearm, started for the Potomac Nationals, on Friday May 26, against the Salem Avalanche. The righty threw three scoreless innings, allowing three hits and striking out two. Astacio, in his 15th major league season, was signed by the Nationals as a free agent in February. In 2005, Astacio closed the season with the San Diego Padres, pitching Game 2 of the National League Divisional Series against the St. Louis Cardinals. Washington is Astacio's eighth organization in the big leagues. He began his career in the Dodgers organization, making his major league debut in 1992. Since then, Astacio has won 124 games over 14 seasons, including a short stint with the Houston Astros in 2001.

BRIAN SCHNEIDER REHABS WITH THE NATS: Washington Nationals catcher Brian Schneider was in a Potomac on a rehab assignment Tuesday and Wednesday. Last night he got one hit in four at-bats. Schneider also scored a run and doubled home another run. Tuesday night he went 1x5 with a single in the fifth inning. Schneider was in the lineup as the DH both nights. He was placed on the DL by Washington on May 13 because of a left hamstring strain. Schneider is eligible to come off the DL on Friday. This year, the 29 year old, is hitting .230-1-14 in 30 games with Washington. Overall, at the big league level, he is hitting .255-38-199. He has played in 534 games at the big league level for Montreal and Washington. Schneider made his big league debut in 2000 with Montreal. He last played at the Advanced level in 1998 while with Jupiter of the Florida State League.

BIG LEAGUERS IN POTOMAC: Jose Guillen is the 4th player this year and the 26th player in franchise history to play for Potomac after making their Major League debut. Guillen was with Potomac June 8 and June 9 and played in three games. John Patterson started for Potomac on June 7 against Winston-Salem. Pedro Astacio, who pitched on Friday, May 26, follows Brian Schneider who played in Potomac's games on Tuesday and Wednesday, May 23 and 24. Last year there were four players that fit into this category. Jose Vidro, Wil Cordero and Henry Mateo were in Potomac on rehab assignments. Ramon Castro and Anthony Ferrari were on Potomac's roster. Other notables include Andy (1997) and Alan (1999) Benes, Ray Lankford (1997), Jeff Austin (2004), Joe Charboneau (1984) and Don Robinson (1986). Tony Blanco is the only player to play in Potomac both before and after his big league debut.

RAIN, RAIN GO AWAY: Rain has gotten in the way of the Nationals season this year. There have been four games suspended due to rain – April 7 in Salem, April 21 in Frederick, May 14 versus Myrtle Beach and May 15 in Kinston. Potomac went on to lose the games on April 8 and May 15 and win the contest on April 23. The game from May 14 was made up on June 1 and Potomac battled back from a 4-1 deficit to win 6-5. In addition, there have been six games postponed because of rain or field conditions.

FOR OPENERS: This 2006 season opener in Salem marks the fifth consecutive year that the Nationals franchise has opened at Salem Memorial Baseball Stadium. The Nationals are 3-2 in season openers at Salem over the last five years. The Nationals suffered a 4-3 walk-off defeat after leading 3-1 going into the ninth inning on April 7, 2006. The Nationals clipped the Avs by a score of 2-1 on April 8, 2005. In 2004, on April 9th, the Potomac Cannons beat the Salem Avalanche 10-2. On April 4, 2003, the Cannons lost 4-2 and back on April 5, 2002 Potomac beat Salem 10-7. Furthermore, including this year, the P-Nats franchise has played Salem first in eleven of the franchise's twenty-eight year existence. Potomac has posted a 7-4 record versus Salem in opening games. Overall the franchise has won seven of its last nine and nine of its last twelve openers.

THE ROSTER: The Opening Day 25-man roster featured 12 pitchers, three catchers, six infielders and four outfielders. Highlighting this year's roster includes top Washington organization prospects in Collin Balester, Clint Everts and Mike Hinckley who were rated by Baseball America as the number two, three and seven prospects in the organization. The 2006 roster also features 10 players who spent part or all of last season in Potomac and 15 who played under current manager Randy Knorr in Savannah, Ga. last season.

ROAD WARRIORS: For the second straight season, the P-Nats opened up with a ten-game road trip. The Nationals opened the season by playing 13 of their first 16 games on the road. In 2005, Potomac went 4-6 on the opening trip.

OUT WITH THE OLD, IN WITH THE NEW: In 2005, the Potomac Nationals unveiled new team colors, a new team name, a new affiliation, new uniforms, and even a new mascot. The 2005 season marks the P-Nats first as an affiliate of the Washington (DC) Nationals. This franchise has been affiliated with a total of seven teams, including the Nationals. The former affiliates include the Seattle Mariners (1979), the Pittsburgh Pirates (1981-86), the New York Yankees (1987-93), the Chicago White Sox (1994-96), the St. Louis Cardinals (1997-2002), and the Cincinnati Reds (2003-04). Furthermore, in 1978 this franchise was not affiliated and played independently and in 1980 was a Co-Op, getting players primarily from the Baltimore Orioles and Pittsburgh Pirates.

MID SEASON SKIPPER CHANGES: This is the third time in franchise history that there has been a mid-season managerial change in Potomac. Other managers who left in mid-season: Wally Moon (fired 1988) and Mark Weidemaier (fired 1989). Moon was replaced by Gene Tenace and Weidemaier by Stump Merrill.








SO LONG RANDY... ENJOY THE SHOW AGAIN: Potomac manager Randy Knorr has been appointed the bullpen coach for the Washington Nationals. Washington Nationals Vice President and General Manager Jim Bowden made the announcement. Edgar Caceres, who managed the 2004 Potomac Cannons, will take the helm beginning tonight. Caceres is the first manager to lead this franchise under two different Major League affiliates, first the Reds and now the Nationals. Knorr managed the P-Nats to a 31-36 record after spending last year in Savannah (SAL) as the manager of the Sand Gnats. Knorr's combined record as a manager is 93-112.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?: Prior to the 2005 season, the P-Nats were called the Potomac Cannons and were affiliated with the Cincinnati Reds organization (2002-03). Since 1978, the team's inaugural season this franchise has had six names, including the Alexandria Dukes (1978, 1980-83), the Alexandria Mariners (1979), the Prince William Pirates (1984-86), the Prince William Yankees (1987-88), and Cannons (1989-2004).








FRANCHISE ALL STARS IN THE BIGS: This year the Prince William / Potomac franchise had two alums appear in MLB's All Star Game in Pittsburgh. The American League beat the National League 3-2. St. Louis' Albert Pujols was on the National League roster while Detroit's Magglio Ordonez was on the American League roster. Pujols, appeared in his 5th All Star game, was voted by the fans as the starting 1B, and went 0x3 with a strikeout. Ordonez, who played in his fourth Mid Summer Classic, pinch-hit for AL starter Kevin Rogers and struck out. Barry Bonds is the former franchise player that leads in All Star appearances with 13.
